Location

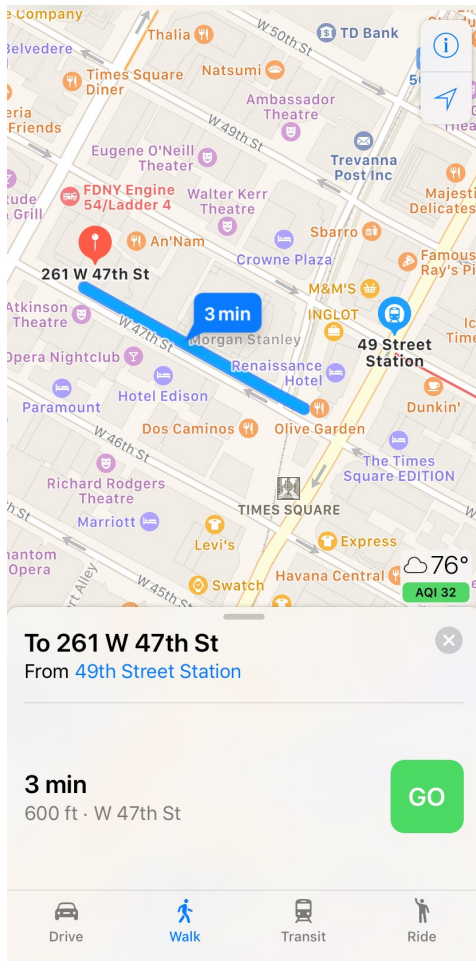


The Samuel J. Friedman Theatre is located at 261 West 47th Street.

The theatre is on the north side of the street between Broadway and 8th Avenue. It is closer to 8th Avenue than to Broadway.

The theatre is fully accessible to people with disabilities.

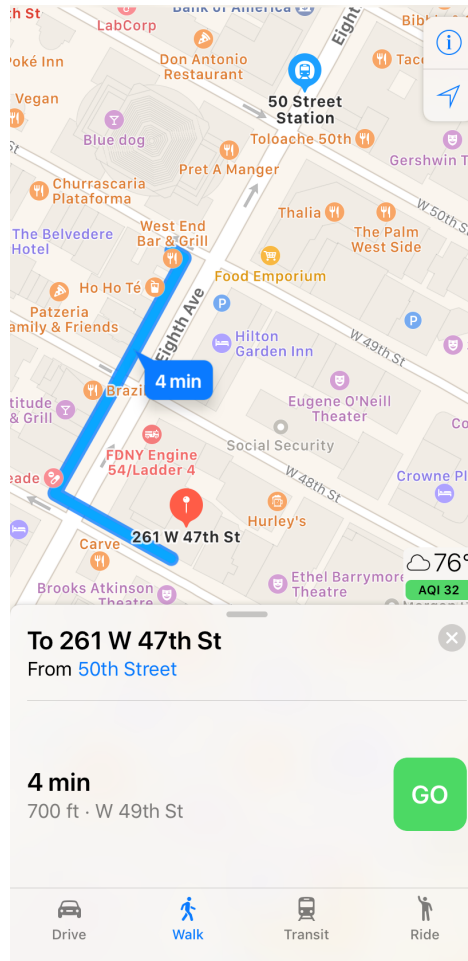

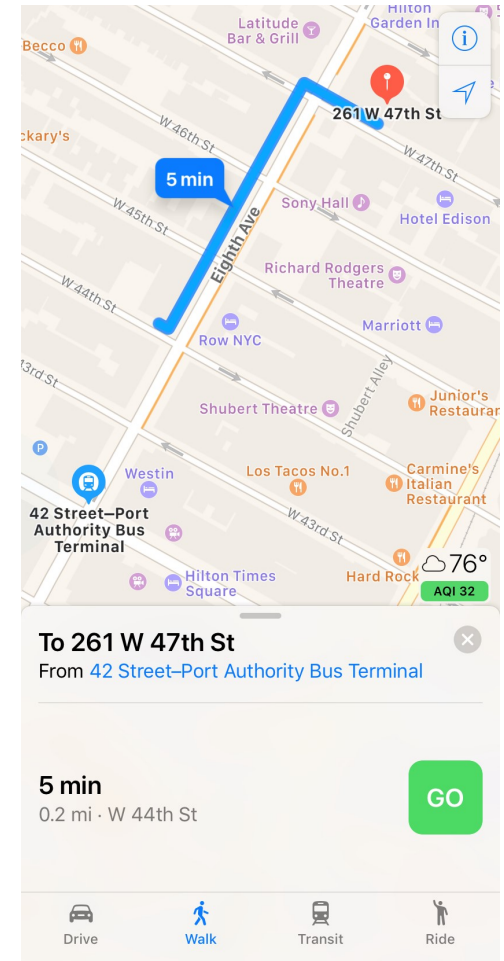

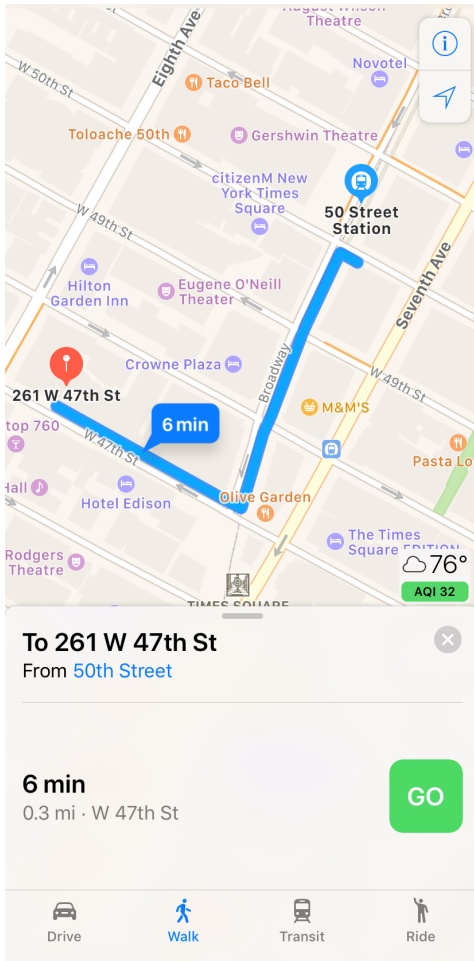

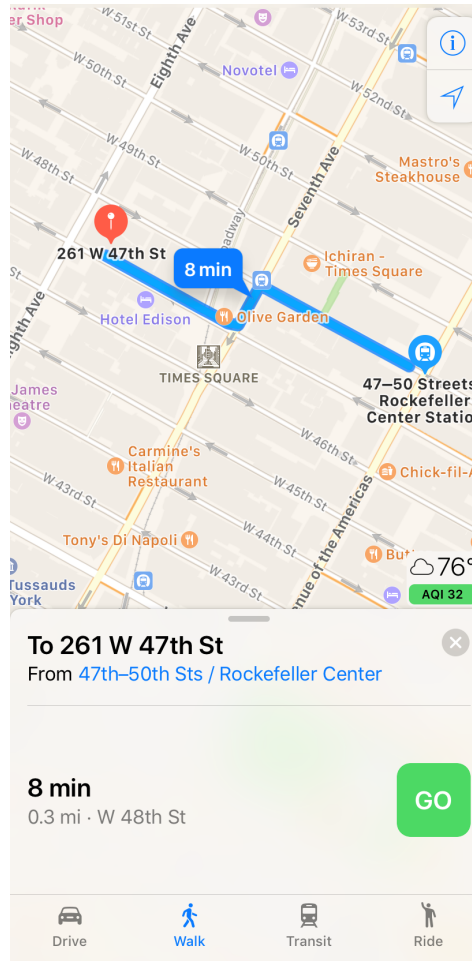

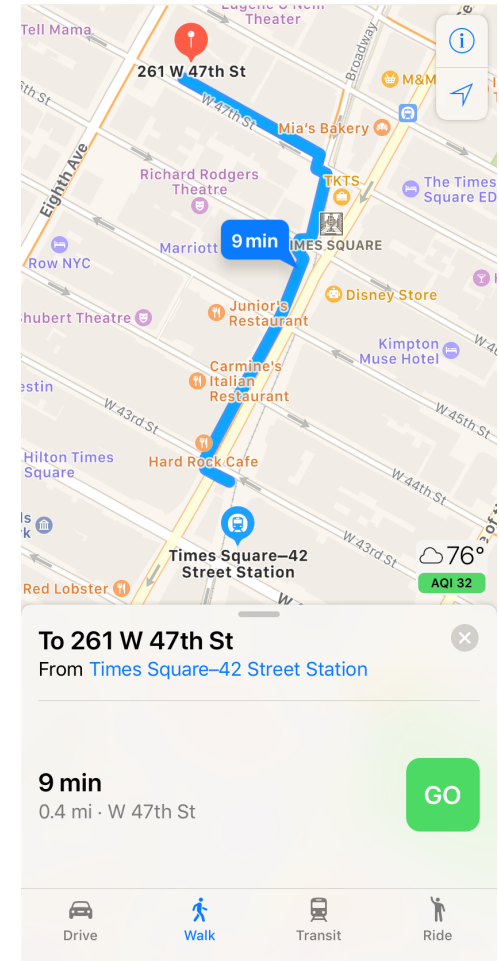

ARRIVING AT THE THEATRE:

Entering the building



Individuals who need to purchase or pick up their ticket from the box office should use the entrance on the left side of the exterior lobby.

Individuals who arrive to the theatre with their ticket should use the entrance on the right side of the exterior lobby.

ARRIVING AT THE THEATRE:

Entering the building



All individuals entering the building with large purses, backpacks, tote bags, and other large items will be asked to open them for inspection by our security team.

You may see a Public Safety Officer and their canine colleague at the theatre. The dog goes from theatre to theatre sniffing for explosives.

ARRIVING AT THE THEATRE:

Picking up tickets



The box office is on the left side of the exterior lobby. You may pick up or purchase tickets at either window.

To the right of the box office is the house board. It lists any special information you need to know about the production including things like use of strobe lights, haze, loud noises, or smoking on stage.

ARRIVING AT THE THEATRE:

Pre-Show at the Friedman



You are welcome to enter the interior lobby and our lounges 45 minutes prior to curtain.

There are three steps up to the interior lobby entrance.

In order to enter the interior lobby, please have your ticket out and ready to be scanned.

An elevator provides access to all interior levels without the need to use any steps. It is located on the right side of the exterior lobby. Patrons should ask the ticket taker to scan their ticket before entering the elevator.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

Accessibility Devices



The Friedman has a built-in induction loop which you can use with your own hearing devices. Additionally, you can check out free accessibility devices at the podium located immediately to your left when you enter the interior lobby. These include:

- Assistive Listening Devices
- Hearing-aid Compatible Devices (T-Coil Loops)
- Closed Captioning (beginning 3 weeks after opening night)
- Audio Description (beginning 3 weeks after opening night)
 - Braille and Large Print Playbills

You'll need to leave a photo ID or credit card when checking out one of these devices.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

The Solomon Lounge on the Lower Level



There are 27 steps down from the interior lobby to the lower level's Solomon Lounge.

There is a bar in this lounge where you can purchase snacks, soft drinks, and alcoholic beverages.

The MTC Store is located adjacent to the bar.

There is a coat room which contains free storage lockers for jackets and oversized items.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

Restrooms



Restrooms are located in the Solomon Lounge on the lower level behind the MTC history wall.

Restrooms are also located on either side of the Mezzanine level.

Gender diversity is welcome at Manhattan Theatre Club. Please use the restroom that best aligns with your personal gender identity or expression.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

Premier Circle



There are 19 steps up from the interior lobby to the Premier Circle.

Members of Manhattan Theatre Club's Patron program have exclusive access to the Patrons' Lounge located on the Premier Circle level.

The restrooms located in this lounge are for use by Patron program members only.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

Mezzanine



There are 37 steps up from the interior lobby to the Mezzanine.

There is a coat room which contains free storage lockers for jackets and oversized items. There's a water fountain in the coat room.

GETTING AROUND THE THEATRE:

The House is Open



The doors to the theatre will open approximately 30 minutes prior to curtain.

Please have your tickets out prior to entering the theatre.

Match the section, row, and seat number on your ticket to the signs outside each theatre door to determine your best point of entry.



INSIDE THE HOUSE:

Please find your seat



There are steps in the Orchestra, Premier Circle, and Mezzanine.

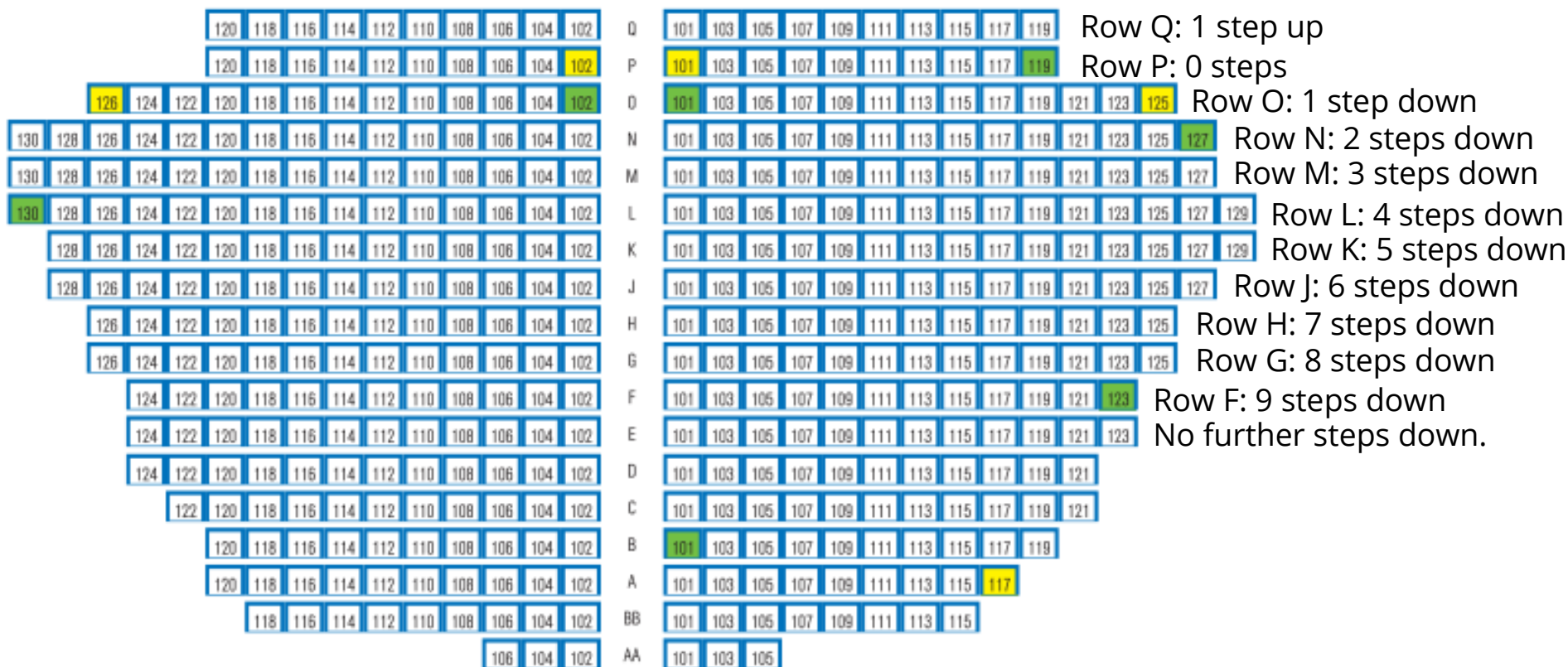
If you are seated in rows AA-F on house left (ODD numbers) of the Orchestra and wish to avoid steps, please speak with the Theatre Manager about using the entrance without steps.

You will hear an announcement five minutes before the performance begins. At this time, please find your seat, turn off cellular phones, unwrap hard candies, and settle in for the show.

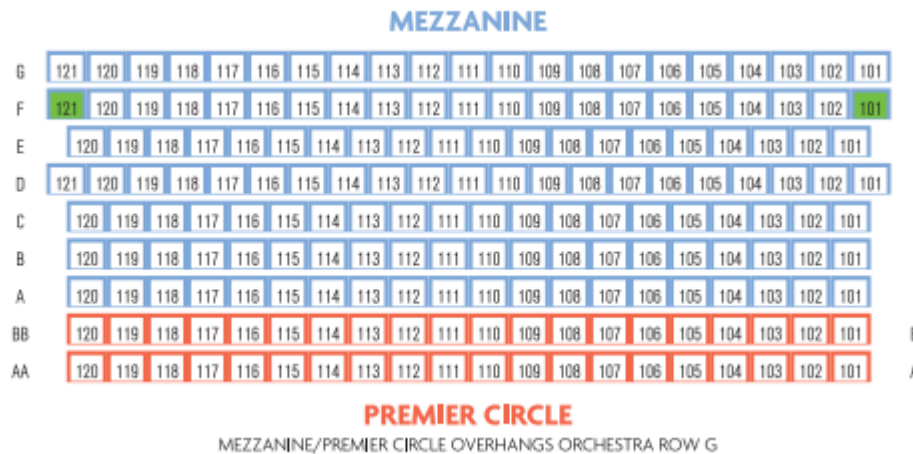
Number of Steps in the Premier Circle and Mezzanine
